1.2 GENERAL

The town Sawai Madhopur take its name from Maharaja Sawai Madho Singh I, chief of the east while Jaipur state (1751-1768 AD) by whom it was laid out some what on the plan of the capital. The area comprising the district of Sawai Madhopur used to be a part of the former Karauli state and the Sawai Madhopur, Gangapur and Hindoun Nizamats of the former Jaipur state. The former Karauli State was integrated in to Matsya union on the March 17th 1948. Which latter merged with former Jaipur State to form the united State of Greater Rajasthan on the 15th may 1949. Sawai Madhopur was formed as a District and to remain as such. At the time of its formation the district was into four subdivisions namely Sawai Madhopur, Gangapur city, Hindaun, Karauli. On the 19th July 1997. Sawai Madhopur District was divided into two district namely, Sawai Madhopur and Karauli.

1.3 GEOGRAPHICAL AREA

The District is located in the south-eastern region of Rajasthan between latitude of 25 °45' North and 26 °41' North and between 75 °59' East and 77 ° East. The District is bounded on the north by Dausa on south by Kota and Bundi districts and the Chambal River [which forms a natural boundary separating the district from the Morena district of Madhya Pradesh] on the North East by Karauli district and on the west and north-west by the karauli district and west & north Tonk and Jaipur districts respectively.

The total geographical area of the district is 5043 square kilometer Record for land utilisation purpose, which is 1.90 percent of the total area of the State.

1.4 LAND USE PATTERN IN THE DISTRICT

1.5 PHYSIOGRAPHIC

1.5:2 District Sawai Madhopur has partly plain and partly undulating hilly terrain. The Sawai Madhopur sub-division can be described as hilly areas while the remaining tract is generally level and plain. The plain is fertile and then soil in most parts is in light & sandy.

The South and south east portion of the district comprise hills and broken ground which form a part of a vast track of rugged region enclosing the narrow valley of the Chambal river. Ranges of Aravali hills lie in the northern western and southern parts of the district. Sawai Madhopur sub-division is more or less a mountainous tract.

1.5:3 The historical fort of Ranthambhore is also situated in the Sawai Madhopur sub-division. The height from the sea level in the district varies from 400 to 600 metres. The highest peak in the north-western Aravali hill located in Bamanwas tehsil is 527 meters high Bhairan and Utgir are notable peaks in the south of the district. The area of Gangapur sub-division is almost plain with only a few hillocks scattered here and there. The banks of the Chambal are the

main rivers in the district. The Bank is the largest among them. It is also important to note that no part of the district falls in the category of a desert and also there are no natural springs in the district.

1.6 ADMINISTRATIVE SET-UP

1.6:1 The district is presently composed of Eight subdivision viz. Sawai Madhopur, Choth Ka Barwara, Khandar.bonli, Malarna Dungar, gangapur city,Vazirpur, bamanwas and Six panchyat samities viz. Sawai Madhopur, khandar, bonli, gangapur, bamanwas and Chauth ka Barwara & eight tehsils. Which continue in existence to date ever since the fomulation of the district. There are also Five sub-tehsils viz. Baharawanda kalan (Teh. Khandar),Mitrapura(Teh.Bonli), Talawra (Teh. Gangapur city) and barnala and Bhanwara(Teh.Bamanwas)

1.7 CLIMATE AND RAINFALL

The district has a dry climate except during the short rainy season. The winter season extends from December to March while the summer season extends from March end to third week of June. The rainy season which follows last units about the third week of September and (thereafter) follow the autumn. The normal annual rainfall in the district is 665.4 mm. The mean daily maximum temperature is about 41 Ocean the mean daily minimum temperature is about 8°C in January, Relative humidities are generally over 60 percent during the south-west monsoon and during rest of the year the air is dry. Temperature Maximum 47⁰C and Minimum 4⁰ C.

1.8 FOREST FLORA AND FAUNA

1.8:1 The district Sawai Madhopur is rich in wild life and has a wide variety of evenly balanced fauna. The area pulsates with innumerable huge mass of animals, birds, reptiles, fish, tigers, leopards or panthers, wild dog (dholc), sambhars, nil gais, chitals, chinkaras, wild pigs and sloth bears are found commonly. The bird found are pea, fowl, parakeets, owls, egrets, pond herons, grey and purple herons, stroks, whistling teals, nukta, comb-duck, checkul teal, sopt bill and coots.

1.8:2 *The game sanctuary of the district known as Ranthambhore Wild Life Sanctuary, established in 1957-58, is situated at a distance of about 15kms. to the north-east of the Sawai Madhopur railway station. In 1947 the area of this game sanctuary was included in tiger project financed by the World Wild life Fund under a centrally sponsored scheme. The game sanctuary which has been now declared the National Park and now park & now placed under the administrative central & charge of the Field Director, Tiger Project, Ranthambhore, Sawai Madhopur. The Tiger Project aims not only preserving the tigers but also its natural prey and virtuality all the flora and fauna and the environment and the project covers an area of 450 sq. km.*

1.8:3 *The important trees found in the district are Neem, Beri, Dhok, Arauja, Tendu, Gurjan, Salar, Khini, Suntha, Khair, Jamun, Aam, Gameri, Khejra, Pila Gauva, Kair, hingot, Arni and Pipla manufacture of toys etc.*

CHAPTER – II

RESOURCES

2.1 HUMAN RESOURCES

Human Resources is the basic input for manning the existing and future industrial development of an area. The total working force in the district as per census 2011 was recorded at number of people.

2.2: Working force & Occupational Pattern

According to the figure of population census 2011, the population of Sawai Madhopur district is 1335551 out of which are 704031 male and 631520 female Rural population constitute about 80.05% and remaining are living in urban area.

According to census, about 80.05 of the total population of the district reside in rural areas while the remaining 19.95% of the population are residing in the urban areas. The figure of population in the district as per 2011 census urban population 266467 and rural population 1069084.

5. Products of Animal Husbandry

5.1 Availability of Dairy Products

5.1.1 Milk

On the basis of availability of milk, this district has an important place in the state. To meet out the targets of Dairy Development Programmes in Sawai Madhopur and Karauli, the District milk producing Co-Operative Societies were established in the year 1978.

The district does not have only distinctive breed of milk animals. However, large number of milk animals offer potential for operating milk routes for collection and marketing of surplus milk through organisation of co-operative societies. Over the last two years there has been expansion of milk routes in the district and presently about 288 villages are covered by the milk routes operated by Sawai Madhopur and Karauli Zila Dugdh Utpadak Sahakari Samiti Ltd. still there is need for further expansion of these routes to cover more villages.

5.2 Wool Availability

Sheep are reared in the district many for wool and meat. Regarding wool each sheep yields approximately 2.4 kg. of wool every year. Thus, there is potential for 160 tone kg. of wool within the district per year as per 2012 population of livestock. The wool produced in the district is supplied to other places. In case if this wool is utilised within the district, it will certainly contribute by raising the local employment through the growth of woollen textile industry .

5.3 Meat Availability

Assuming on an average, a mortality rate of 20% of sheep and goats and on an average 25 kg. of meat per sheep and 15 kg. per goat. The annual availability of meat in the district is estimated at about 14.57 tones.

5.4 Leather Availability

The district has a large cattle population. The discussion with district official reveal that the mortality rate could safely be assumed to be 10% and 25 square feet of hide per animal, which may contribute about 15.70 Lac square feet of hide in one year duration.

5.5 Bones - *The availability of bones is estimated to be around 4800 tones per annum.*

6.GEOLOGY AND MINERALS

6.1 Mines

A land-located district Sawai Madhopur terrain is mostly formed by pre-Cambrian Metamorphic, Igneous, and Sedimentary Rocks belonging to pre-aravali Vindhya. Pre-Aravali rocks units Comprising quartzites, mica schists gneisses and migmatites and cover the north-western part of the district between Lalsot and Karauli. The rocks of Vindhya super group represented by the Kaimur, Rewa and Bhandar group, consisting mainly of various types of shales, sandstones and limestone. These rocks occupy the south-eastern part of the district are separated from the older rocks namely pre-aravali and Delhi's by a reverse fault called the great Boundary fault trending north-east, south-west.

Mines Department is Restarted since September 2013 in district Sawai Madhopur.

(A) There are good deposits of limestone in the district. It is quarried at various places in Sawai Madhopur tehsil particularly at Phalodi and in Gangapur Tehsil.

(B) The limestone used for manufacturing the cement occurs extensively in Phalodi and Bazrakho Area. Production of Bajri and Brick earth is also reported in small quantities from these areas.

Note- Phalodi and Bazrakho Area situated in Tiger Project.

(C) Some deposits of high-grade clay are found in Sawai Madhopur and Khandar tehsils. While clay, firing to white colour, with good plasticity is quarried at Raesena. Clay found at Basu is also white in colour and is practically free from grit. The estimated reserves of this deposit are about one-Lac tones.

(D) Ordinary silica sand an important raw material for glass industry, is found in Gangapur tehsil, though its reserves not been estimated.

6.2 Minerals

The district is endowed with a variety of mineral resources both metallic and nonmetallic. The metallic minerals include lead copper and iron ore where as the nonmetallic minerals includes limestone, clays, silica sand and talc.

Among other mineral found in the district are laterite, red-oxide, bentonite, barite, manganese sand and bricks clay etc.

Major minerals found in Sawai Madhopur district include lime stone (cement grade) and silica sand, soapstone, fire-clay, white clay, china clay and talc, while minor minerals quarried are sand stone, limestone (for lime making), masonry stone, patti katla, kankar, bajri and mill stone extensive exploration has indicated the presence of base metals like copper, lead-ore and iron in the area.

7. FOREST RESOURCES

7.1 Areas -

The area under forests in the district is 988.60 Square Km out of which the area reserved for Wild Life (Ranthambore Tiger Project) under forest is about 777.54 Sq. Km years 2014-15.

7.2 Resources

The forest covers an area of about 27.77 percent of the total area of the district Dhokara, Khair, Bambu, Neem, Pepel, Sisam, Cheela etc. are the major trees of these forest. Major forest products are cooking wood, Charcool, Tendu leaves, Guegal, Gum, Kattha, Honey etc.

Some of such important places are Ranthambhore Tiger Project (National Park), Ganish Ji Temple at Ranthmbhore Fort, Chauth Ka Barwara,shivad,village is known for the Ghushmeshwar Mahadev temple dedicated to Lord shiva.Black bull area (Near Itawa village) Surwal lake & Mansarowar lake for birds. Rameshwaram is 60 Kms far from sawai Madhopur on the onfluence of Banas and chambal*

river etc. Five Zone more sanctuaries developed by the forest dept. (Balas sanctuary, kundal and chiri kho) Mansingh Santuary During last Seven years The arrivals of tourists in the district has remained as given under Pali Ghat for Boating Point 35 Km. from Sawai Madhopur.

13.1 EXISTING INDUSTRIAL SCENRIO

In Sawai Madhopur district, there are four industries which belong to medium and large scale sector simultaneously. Under Forth Census Total 808 units were surveyed witch registered in the District Industries centre up to 31st March 2011. The pace of economic as well as the industries in the district is not to the desired level. A part of the above, the district is also not known for any sophisticated industrial crafts excepts for certain minor manufacturers, having markets in the neighbouring areas. For the rest here diatary artisans like weavers gold smith, black smith etc. meet local demand.

13.2 EXISTING INDUSTRIAL STATUS.

LARGE AND MEDIUM SCALE INDUSTRIES

(A) M/s JAIPUR UDYOG Ltd. (LARGE SCALE UNIT)

There is only one such unit in the district viz. M/s Jaipur Udyog Ltd. Sawai Madhopur which is presently closed on account of its high degree of sickness. The concern was manufacturing portland cement and was once the biggest cement factory in the country and in the whole of south east Asia. It was established in 1948 as a private limited company but was subsequently converted into a public limited company in 1955. The first plant of the unit was commissioned in 1933 with a capacity of 500 tones per day. Production started in 1953. Two more plants each with a capacity of 600 tonnes of cement a day were installed in 1956 and 1957 and a fourth one with a capacity of 750 tonnes a day was installed in 1959. The total installed capacity of this plant is around 2450 tonnes per day or 8.55 Lacs tonnes per annum, the highest in the country at that time, with four plants having 4 Kilns, 4 Cement mells, 4 Packaging Machines and two Crushers. The rich deposits of high-grade limestone found in the district provide the factory with the main raw material. The quarries are situated near Phalodi and Bazrakho, 25 to 30 km. from Sawai Madhopur. The other raw materials are gypsum obtained from Bikaner district and blast furnance slag obtained from Bhilai steel plant, besides packing

material. The unit has its own powerhouse to generate electricity required for running the machines at the factory and for use in excavating limestone.

**(B) *M/s L. P. G. GAS REFILLING PLANT
(MEDIUM SCALE INDUSTRIES)***

There is again only one such unit in district viz. L.P.G. Gas Refilling Plant of Indian Oil Corporation, which presently has the installed capacity to fill 50 MT L.P.G. per year. Unit is closed since 1st August 2007. The equipment and machinery of plant has been shifted to other place dismantling and scrap has been sold land is being to be sold and process of to the sale of plant is going on.

**(C) *TILAM SANGH GANGAPUR PROJECT SALODA INDUSTRIAL AREA
(Musturd oil)***

13.2.2 In order to indicate potential industries at Block/Panchayat Samiti level an attempt has been made to broadly identify and indicate group of industries, which are in existence at different Panchayat Samities. Table gives details of existence of various groups of industries in different Panchayat Samities.

CONCENTRATION OF ARTISANS IN SAWAI MADHOPUR DISTRICT

The artisan are by and large, scattered and there is no large concentration of artisans at a particular place. Attempt has been made to identify the cluster of artisans in different Panchayat Samities so that it may be helpful in formulation policies for their upliftment and growth.

The distribution of artisans Panchayat Samity-wise and their nature of activities and concentration is being given below :

(1) SAWAI MADHOPUR PANCHAYAT SAMITI

In Sawai Madhopur town, there are more than 100 weavers residing in Ansari Mohalla. They are mostly Muslims and traditionally doing the same job for many years. In various villages of this Panchayat Samiti artisans are engaged in manufacture of leather articles black smithy, wooden articles etc. In some villages, there were found activities related to manufacture of weaving, bamboo basket, pottery, wooden Toys & khus articles, Tie & Die, Kashida kari, Bangles, Bidi making

(1)(2) KHANDAR PANCHAYAT SAMITI

The major activities in this Panchayat Samiti relate to manufacture of wooden articles, dona pattal, bidi making, bamboo basket, Black smithy, Pottery & Leather Shoes

(3) BONLI PANCHAYAT SAMITI

The nature of artisan activities and places of concentration in different villages in the aforesaid Gangawara and Bans Torda for sculptors (stone carving) Carpet Weaving, Pottery, carpentry.

(4) GANGAPUR PANCHAYAT SAMITI

In Gangapur Panchayat Samiti activities nature of Leather Shoe, Pottery, Wooden, Articles & Bamboo Basket.

(5) BAMANWAS PANCHAYAT SAMITI

There are about ten families of sculptors, about 10 families of weavers village Jivad and about 25-30 families of shoe-makers in see od, Liwali and Morpa Villages respectively.

By and large, the economic condition of artisans were not found satisfactory. On Account of constrains like Lac of organisation, finance and marketing support, their economic activities are only able to sustain their living and there is no visible growth.

13.3 EXPORT POTANTIAL ITEMS

Neither the district is manufacturing any such item, which is presently being exported nor the district possess any specific art or item which has export potential in near future. In Sawai Madhopur district woolen carpet, readymade garment, tiger painting are manufacturing for export purpose but there is hardly any are exported.

14.1 POTENTIAL INDUSTRIAL AND OTHER CONTRIBUTORY FACTORS

Sawai Madhopur district is considered to be a well known District of Rajasthan but it is industrially slightly less developed district than other districts of the state. It has potential for development of demand based, resource based manpower, agriculture and the banking structure in the area is proper. Sawai Madhopur District has not a bright scope large scale industrial development. The main profession of the area is mainly farming and animal husbandry. Hotel industry is growing fastly. Handicraft and art product painting craft is also growing.

WEAKNESSES

(A) *Due to the Ranthambhore National Park there is no scale*

for large scale industries because they can not get site clearance

(B) **CONSTRAINTS**

The industrial growth of Sawai Madhopur district is lacking of water supply in adequate road links lack of entrepreneurial skills and lack of proper incentives and concessions provided by state government as well as central Govt. and secondly constraints is the existing tiger project i.e. National Park in Sawai Madhopur district because of which no large / medium scale units response for pollution may be allowed within certain kilometers areas from the Park few years ago the big fertilizer plants a project estimated cost Rs. 750 crore has been shifted from Sawai Madhopur to Kota (Gadepan).

14.2 RESOURCES

- (a) *This district is linked with broad gauge on the Railway route Delhi to Mumbai and the availability of various resources in the district. Moreover district has a large strength of live stock population and variety of small scale units on agro based which can also be utilized for industrial growth.*
- (b) *Agro based products small millets (Bajara, Jowar) and pulses in Kharif crop and wheat, Grain, Barley, Mustard in Rabi crop. Specially the production of Grapes, Guava, cultivation are popular even transport every state of India in vegetables are grown like tomato, chilies, citrus*

and carrot, Radish, Peas and various vegetables are abundantly grown in the district, Guava is the popular fruit of Sawaimadhapur-district.

(d) *The Mega State Highway Project has been completed and This will connected the Sawai Madhopur District to Dausa & Kota Lies on two major High ways viz. N.H.116 & 11B. Resulting in well Road Connectivity of the Sawai Madhopur District to the Middle and Western region of the India.*

14.7 STRATEGY FOR ARTISAN/HANDLOOM WEAVERS UPGRADATION

Concentrating of artisan at various places at Sawai Madhopur district. The following artisan based potential cottage industries are proposed at appropriate site. This is purely basis of availability of artisans carpentry, weaving, shoe making, sculpturing, painting ambriodory and black smithy & carpet Weaving etc.

(A) MAJOR PROBLEMS BEING FACED BY ARTISANS

The major problems are confronted by the local artisan are as follows :

1. Short comings to technical skilled
2. Imbediment of quality standards.
3. Not proper supply of raw material.

Cited above defected three problems. It is also observed to see that almost all artisans units were suffering since long time mainly only three grounds such as marketing, monetary crisis, and organisation.

(B) REMEDIAL MEASURE (FACTORS)

Basically above depicted observation in regards of several problems being confronted by the artisans units. Mainly the following steps are suggested properly or being taken.

- (a) Upliftment of the artisan units to propagate quality products through appropriate training and skills advancement about the programme and also through upgradation/ mechanization of technology.
- (b) Steps to impulse these artisan to take up independent production and marketing.
- (c) To assign institutional support to these artisan or meeting there financial needs as

well as proper supply of raw material to these artisan and for marketing their products through proper marketing channel.

- (d) formation of co-operative societies SHG improving and promotional efforts through

various government bodies should be taken into account to promote on priority basis the co-operative societies for these artisans engaged in various crafts. The promoters should be advising and practising craftman themselves. Who have there stack in particular crafts industry and have curocity to make on dignity and honest lively hood availing a fair industry and have desire to make all honest lively hood availing a fair use of good as well as an institutional facilities. It should be tried aggressively that almost all the heads of the families involved in there handicrafts/handloom/traditional units should be the member of the co-operative societies.

Such co-operative should also be fulfilled that their main objectives is to

function sustaining manner and not merely to minimum facilities provided by the state/central and various other institutions.

JUSTIFICATION FOR RESOURCE BASED UNITS AGRO BASED UNITS OIL EXPELLER/OIL GHANIES

(A) The Raw material generally used in districts for such items to sesame, groundnut, rapseed, mustard. The Production of sesame, groundnut, rapseed & mustard provide enough scope to set up oil expeller units in the district specially in Sawai Madhopur, Gangapur city & Bonli, Blocks.

(B) The total area under oil seeds was 211145 hectares in year 2016-17 and the production of oil seeds was 12159 MT. The major producing area of linseed, Rapseed, Mustard, Soya bean are Gangapur City, Bamanwas, Khandar & Sawai Madhopur Block in order to importance besides the production of the oilseed in these tehsils mustared, rapseed, sesame are brought from the adjoining district & arrival are so much that a sufficient surplus after consuming be these existing expeller and Ghanies left in the area. The surplus provides further potential for establishing more units oil expeller in Sawai Madhopur, Gangapur & Bonli Block.

(C) Agriculture implements the field implements used by the agriculturist in the

district are partly old & partly new the indeginous plough, levellers, old crucher, tracter trollies and other implements etc. are made of wood and seed dril is made of hard wood/bamboo. A part from these bullock drawn implements several hand tools implements are gradually being replaced by the modern agriculture implements, which indicates a graduall tall in the use of wooden plough & faster increasing rate in using cruches, oil engines & tractor parts. This shows that we agriculturist have adopted implements prepared own modern techniques and given up the use of old one.

(D) LIVE STOCK BASED INDUSTRIES

Agriculture has been assigned the highest priority and live stock development from an important part of this programme. This is the total strength of live stock includes cows, Buffaloes, sheep, goats, camel, pigs, horse, dogs, hens etc. Table gives the clear cut idea of the live stock position and also most of the families particularly Muslims & Khatik are engaged in meat marketing even they are earning a lot of money even is profession is developing day by day. It has an opportunity for development more industrial unit based on live stock like bone crushing unit can be setup in the district.

(E) Mineral based Industries, in district Sawai Madhopur District in is one of the major non-metlsluic minerals of ceramic grade producing in the

state. It produces ceramic minerals mainly and cement stone, building construction stone, soap stone, silica sand, limestone, White clay, Quarts etc. A detailed account of various minerals within district of Sawai Madhopur from with the location & scope of establishment of mineral based industries.

(F) ENGINEERING INDUSTRIES

The Engineering industries, the contribution of Sawai Madhopur district is significant mainly because of adequate supply of raw material, transport facility however to the availability of skilled labour from the workshop located at Sawai Madhopur & Gangapur City. They established units auto-repairing tractor, repairing motor & Trucks body builder units and from fabrication units.

(G) FOREST RESOURCES INDUSTRIES

The total area under the forest in Sawai Madhopur district is 988.60 square K.M. out of which reserved Forest area under forest is about 777.54 sq KM the year of the forest covers an area of about 27.77% of the total area of the district Trees like Dhokara, Kher, Babool, Neem, Pipal, Teack etc. are the major trees of these forest major forest products are cooking wood (fuel), Charcol, Tendu leaves, Gugal, Gum, Katha, Honey etc. A part from these above products one special type of grasses known as Khas is also available in abundance in these forest and used to manufacture scented perfumes etc.

(H) TOURISM

Sawai Madhopur district is well known for Ganpati Temple and National Park Most of the Tourist come all over India. Abroad to visit Ranthambhore & Tiger Project and Ganpati Fair on the biggest fair of this area. Even people come from the all state of India for Darshan and second fair of this district is Chauth Mata fair located on the top of the hill of course it is very charming & very interesting fair and third fair of this district is Ghushmashwar Mahadev fair is religious place Shiwar. Religious place it is very charming place because situated on the hills.

(I) WASHING SOAP

Washing soap occupies an important place in the domestic items required for daily use since the washing soap available at the cheaper rate as compare to synthetic detergent. The scope of establishing of washing soap units of quite encouraging units have been proposed at Kherda, Gangapur, Bonli are producing and good marketing the basic raw material is oil Kastic Soda & sodium silicate.

(J) WOODEN FURNITURE

Wooden furniture units are established at Gangapur & Sawai Madhopur. They are manufacturing Modern furniture like Double Bed, Chairs, Table, Sofa Set & various type of furniture.

(K) WOODEN TOYS

Sawai Madhopur District is well known particularly manufacturing of beautiful & attractive children toys available in various kinds people come

from long distance to purchase toys with in the district four & five units of wooden toys are properly established and supply in the state of Rajasthan.

(L) PERFUMES UNIT

In this profession many families are engaged because here raw material abundantly available even own special Grass, Called Khas Sawai Madhopur is popular for Khas marketing.

(M) WEAVING UNIT

A big group of weavers are engaged in this profession. There are more than 100 weavers dwelling in Bunkar Ka Mohalla. They are mostly belongs to Muslim and Hindu Julaha by case and traditionally.

Cottage industries of the district, include Oil Ghanis, handloom weaving Bidi, dyeing and printing of cloth shoe making wooden toys and other wooden article manufacturing perfume (Itra)

A package of potential industries has been suggested on the basis of availability of resources, demand trend of inhabitants and availability of artisans.

The artisans based industries in the district have been found in the avenue of wooden toys, leather shoes (Plain as well as embroidered), bamboo pottery Namda articles etc. After analysing the concentration of artisans of Panchayat Samiti level

The following possible remedial measures for these artisans are suggested for being taken :

- (1)Development of Artisans unit to produce quality products through adequate training and skill development programmes as well as through upgradation/mechanisation of technology.*
- (2)Steps to encourage these artisans to take up independent production and Marketing.*
- (3)To provide institutional support to these artisans to meet their financial requirement and raw materials as well as adequate marketing channels.*

The organisational problem of these artisans is suggested for being solved through the formation of area wise co-operative societies and the institutional support in the formation such co-operatives by putting their members also in the societies.

Looking to the adherence of age old here ditary techniques and designs which are not merely out moded but are also not economic, the possibilities of mechanisation proved technology and improved designs are suggested for being explored though NRDC, MSME-DI, RSIC, RHDC, Bunkar Sangh KVIC and weaver service centre, etc. The Central Handicrafts Development Centre Banglore should also be consulted from time to time to advise better production techniques. The proposed co-operative societies are also suggested for maintaining a blank of design

ideas etc. Similarly the experiments with new designs and colour combinations are also suggested for being done from time to time.

The adequate training to the artisans of various crafts and field are also being suggested which may be imparted through various concerned institutions like SISI Weavers service centre RSIC, RHDC, Bunkar Sangh and KVIC etc. from time to time.

Looking to the Scatterness of the similar artisans in the district the idea, of mobile Training Centre is also incorporated .

Keeping in view the concentration of handloom weavers in Sawai Madhopur town one Common Facility Centre(CFC) has been proposed to impart the training and other facilities to the artisan unit of handloom weavers.

Looking to the problem of marketing of these artisans units product certain marketing strategies have been proposed through direct channels as well as through the channels of institutions/co-operatives.

Keeping in view the lack of adequate industrialisation, entrepreneurship and also behavioural trials of the people of Sawai Madhopur and Gangapur city entrepreneurship development programmes are proposed for being conducted at these places. These programmes would also benefit the trained/skilled people of the sick and closed units of these areas by developing the entrepreneurship them and thus will enable and encourage them for setting up their own ventures. However the proposed number of such EDP in these areas can be decided on the basis of the response of people in first programmes as and when conducted in Gagapur City and Sawai Madhopur.

there is no clusters of any specific industrial units in the existing industrial areas, which require any common facility like testing laboratory training centre raw material deposit etc. However it is observed that these industrial areas are lacking some basic common facilities like canteen, ESI dispensary First Aid, Police. Hence it is proposed that such basic facilities should be provided in all the existing as well as proposed industrial areas.
